1. The competition is open to young people from 3 to 25 years old in the following 6 age groups :
 - 3 to 5 years old, 6 to 9 years old, 10 to 13 years old, 14 to 17 years old and handicapped children.
 - Finally, young artists from 18 to 25 years old : a commentary about the artistic creation will have to be attached in French or English.
2. Individual or collective works are accepted.
3. Only creations on flat surfaces, such as drawings, pastels, paintings, collages, engravings, are accepted. **3 dimensional creations are not accepted, as well as frame works or rigid materials (for example wood)**. Maximum size accepted : 1.20 x 0.90 metres.
4. Only one project per participant.
5. The deadline for sending the artworks is **Monday, 17th February 2017**. Fill the enclosed label **in block letters in English or French** and stick it on the back of the artwork.
6. The artworks will be sent to the Louis François UNESCO Centre under the competitor's own responsibility and expense. The fees or custom duties will not be paid for by the UNESCO Centre.
7. The jury is composed of professionals from the visual arts sector and people with an intercultural vision and they will meet on **Saturday 18th March 2017** in order to select nominated participants and the 100 winners.
8. The prize giving ceremony will be held Saturday 20th May 2017 during the International arts event 'Graines d'artistes du monde entier' which will take place in Troyes (France) from the 16th to the 20th May 2017.
9. The list of winners will be available on our website <http://centre-unesco-troyes.org> from 10th April 2017.
10. The first prize in each category will receive a beautiful gold plated medal; the second prize in each category will receive a silver plated medal. All other winners will be rewarded with a medal in solid bronze. A diploma of honour will be awarded to each of the 100 winners. The nominees will also receive a diploma of honour.
11. For the "young artists" category (18/25 years) 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes respectively will receive in addition the sum of € 300, € 200 and € 150. The following winners will be rewarded the same way as the other categories (solid bronze medal and diploma of honour).
12. The global endowment of the 2017 competition will be € 8,000.
13. **All sent works, remain the property of the Louis François UNESCO Centre** and may be used for its own activities.
